# Roxboro Community School Scholarship List Last Updated 8-25-09

NRA Youth Summit/Scholarship- The National Rifle Association of America with a grant from the NRA Foundation will host the Fifth Annual Youth Education Summit in Raleigh, September 11-13, 2009. Modeled after the national Youth Education Summit or Y.E.S., the North Carolina State Y.E.S. will be a 3-day, all expense paid educational experience in Raleigh for twenty-five outstanding high school juniors and seniors from across the state. One student will earn an all expense trip to the National Y.E.S. held in Washington, D.C. July 2010, where they will have an opportunity to compete for over \$30,000 in academic scholarships. *For the first time at the state level*, the NC State Y.E.S. program will award the top three candidates scholarships in the amount of \$1000, \$500 and \$250. Applications are attached and must be postmarked by **August 31, 2009**. Applications are available from Mrs. Kimbrough or Mr. Bettendorf.

**Wendy's High School Heisman Award**-This program targets high school seniors who excel in academics, athletics, and student leadership. Applicants must have at least a "B" average and participate in at least one school-sponsored sport. To register and begin the application, students should go to the website <a href="www.wendysheisman.com">www.wendysheisman.com</a> the first 41,000 students who apply will win a Wendy's Gift Card in amounts ranging from \$5 to \$50. The online application must be completed by 5:00 on **October 1, 2009.** 

Morehead-Cain Scholarship - This award, for students attending the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, is based on four criteria: (1) leadership (2) scholarship (approximately within 10% of the graduating class)(3) moral force of character and (4) physical vigor. Financial need is not a consideration. RCS is allowed to endorse students for this scholarship. Other students who feel that they may qualify are encouraged to apply as a direct applicant. **North Carolina Teaching Fellows** - This scholarship is for students interested in becoming a teacher. Applicants should have a minimum SAT of 900 (Math and Reading) and at least a 2.5 GPA. Applications can be found on the website: <a href="www.teachingfellows.com">www.teachingfellows.com</a>. The deadline is **Oct 17, 2009**.

**Parks Scholarship** - This scholarship for students attending NCSU is based on four criteria: (1) scholarship (2) leadership (3) service, and (4) character. RCS will endorse two seniors. Students who are not endorsed by RCS may choose to self-endorse by **October 25, 2009**.

**Horatio Alger Scholarship** - Available for high school seniors (1) planning to pursue a bachelor's degree (may start at community college and the transfer to a 4 year school), (2) who have critical financial need (Preferably \$50,000 or lower adjusted gross income per family) (3) involved in co-curricular and community service activities, (4) have a minimum GPA of 2.0 (5) US citizen. These scholarships range from \$2,500 to \$20,000. **Prudential Spirit of Community Award** - Prudential and the National Association of Secondary School principals wish to honor students who have volunteered and made a difference in their communities. **Thomas Wolfe Scholarship** - This scholarship seeks to identify and reward students with exceptionally focused literary ability and promise. This scholarship offers full financial support to a student attending UNC Chapel Hill for four years. **UNC-Asheville** - To be considered for the both the Laurels Scholarship and Leadership Scholarship, students must apply to UNC-A before **November 15, 2009**.

NC State Centennial Scholarship- Introduced by the North Carolina Textile Foundation in 1999 as a part of the College of Textiles' Centennial Celebration, Centennial Scholarships carry the greatest value among all scholarships at the College of Textiles. Furthermore, the Centennial Scholarship is among the highest valued scholarships offered at North Carolina State University. Up to ten \$47,500 Centennial Scholarships will be awarded to the top applicants, and selection will be based upon demonstrated high academic achievement throughout high school with proven and potential leadership qualities, extracurricular activities and unique life experiences. Students must be nominated by his/her high school or home school for this award, or selfnominate between October 1 and the end of November. This scholarship covers approximately 80 % of expenses to attend NC State, and on-campus housing (or a stipend for an equal amount) and a meal plan (or predetermined allowance), with any remaining funds to be used as a stipend for books and travel expenses (for up to eight semesters). In addition, each Centennial Scholar will have access to a \$7,500 enrichment fund that will allow him/her to participate in a variety of leadership, language immersion and international studies programs, attend international textile shows and benefit from other approved textile enrichment opportunities. **AXA Achievement Scholarship** – The AXA Achievement Scholarship awards \$10,000 scholarships to one student from each state as well as \$15,000 scholarships awarded to 10 national recipients. Applicants should demonstrate ambition and drive, determination to set and reach goals, respect for self, family and community. **Sallie Southall Cotton Scholarship**- Awarded locally by the Roxboro Woman's Club in the amount of \$500.00, and then be submitted for a chance to compete for a state prize of \$22,000.00. Deadline is **December 15, 2009**. Applications may be picked up in the counselor's office, room #114.

Ron Brown Scholar Program - This award will go to highly motivated African-American students who are currently seniors in high school and plan to pursue undergraduate degrees fultime. Recipients must be a US citizen or permanent US resident. The value of this scholarship is \$10,000 for four years. The November 1, 2009 deadline is for the Ron Brown Scholarship, in addition to applications submitted by that deadline will be forwarded

to additional scholarship providers. The scholarships submitted by the **January 9, 2010** will be considered only for the Ron Brown Scholarship.

Intertribal Timber Council Truman D Picard Scholarship - This award is for Native American/ Alaskan students pursuing a degree in Natural Resource. The value of this scholarship is \$1,500 for graduating high school seniors. The deadline is **January 30, 2010** 

**NCSU College of Education** offers many scholarships. American University Frederick Douglas Scholarship – Scholars are selected on the basis of high academic achievement, leadership potential, demonstrated community service, and impressive co-curricular involvement. Preference is given to first generation students, students with high financial need, and/or students from public high schools. Nominees must have at least a 3.2 GPA, rank in top half of class, have satisfactory SAT or ACT scores, and is a US Citizen. Students should complete a nomination form available online at www.admission.american.edu. Applicants must submit an application for admission and nomination form by January 15.

**Burger King Scholars Program** – Applicants must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher, work parttime an average of 15 hours per week or 40 weeks per year, actively involved in community service activities, demonstrate financial need and plan to enroll in an accredited two or four year school by fall of application. **Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship -** Applicants must be US citizens. Judging is based on scholarship, leadership and financial need. Gates Millennium Scholarship – The process requires applicants to complete a Nominee Personal Information Form and to be nominated by an educator and recommended by someone who is familiar with their leadership and community service. Applicants must be African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American or Hispanic American; a citizen/legal permanent resident or national of the United States; have attained a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale; will be enrolling for the first time at a US accredited college or university as fulltime, degree seeking first year student in the fall of 2009; have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities; meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria/ have all three required forms completed and submitted by January 12, 2010. It is recommend that parents and students register within the "Online Communities' tab on the homepage at www.gmsp.org. This site will provide information on the GMS program as well as provide information and techniques to prepare students for college and the GMS application process.

**KFC Colonel's Scholarship** – is dedicated to assisting students with financial need who plan to pursue a bachelor's degree at a public institution within their legal state of residence. To qualify, a student must be: graduating from high school this academic year, maintaining a minimum high school GPA of 2.75 or higher, enrolling in a public, in-state college or university, pursuing a

McKelvey Foundation Entrepreneurial Scholarship – Started by Andy McKelvey, former CEO of Monster.com and lifelong entrepreneur. To qualify: Graduate high school in spring of 2009, attend a 4 year college within the 50 states, own and operate a genuine business, non-profits are eligible, have at least one paid employee. The Jagannathan Scholarship- The NC State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA) administers this scholarship. Deadline is February 9, 2010 for the CSS profile and February 16, 2009 for the application.

National Commission for Cooperative Education Scholarship - As the largest independently sponsored merit co-op scholarship in the United States, the National Commission on behalf of ten NCCE Partner Colleges and Universities will award two hundred merit co-op scholarships of \$6,000 each. Additional information and applications are available at www.co-op.edu. To be eligible for a merit co-op scholarship a student must apply and be accepted at one of the ten partner colleges and universities listed: C. W. Post Campus of Long Island University, Johnson & Wales University, Northeastern University, Rochester Institute of Technology, University of Toledo, Drexel University, Kettering University, Pace University, University of Cincinnati, Wentworth Institute of Technology. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.5 or better on a 4.0 scale. Deadline for submitted application and essay is **February 15**.

North Carolina State USBC Association, Inc. Youth Scholarship - This scholarship is provided by the North Carolina State United States Bowling Congress Association, Inc. (NCS USBCA); a non-profit organization. The award is \$1,500. Applicants must be a current member of the NCS USBCA and bowling in a certified USBC North Carolina youth league. Applicant must have an unimpaired amateur standing in bowling and must have a grade point average with expectations of admission to a recognized institution. Deadline is **February 28**. Solomon Scholarship- This scholarship is awarded by the Person County Education Foundation and was established to encourage Person County students who have shown a high degree of ability and interest in a vocational or technical field and plan to continue their education after high school. This award is valued up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 per year and may be renewable for a second year if the recipient(s) meet certain requirements, with the total award not to exceed \$4,000.00 for a two-year period.
